



Seeing loved ones in care homes during the pandemic

This checklist shows the safety measures you can take when visiting friends and loved ones in care homes during the pandemic

1



Visits will take place at pre-arranged times. In the early phase, there will be up to two designated visitors per resident (visiting one at a time)

2



You will only be allowed to visit if you are feeling well and do not have any COVID-19 symptoms.

3



You will be asked some health questions to ensure that you do not have symptoms of COVID-19.

4



On arrival, you will be asked to take a COVID-19 test. You should wear the mask provided by the Meath. Staff will complete the visitor's book.

5



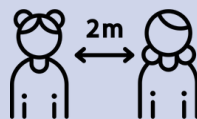
You will be asked to wash your hands and / or apply alcohol based hand gel regularly.

6



Staff will provide an update on the resident's wellbeing and any instructions to support safe visiting.

7



You are encouraged to maintain a 2m safe distance where possible and wear a face mask. It's ok to hold hands for parts of your time together.

8



When you are leaving the Meath, staff will tell you how to safely remove and dispose of your mask (and any PPE) and how to clean your hands.
